DEATH OF W. B. COBB.

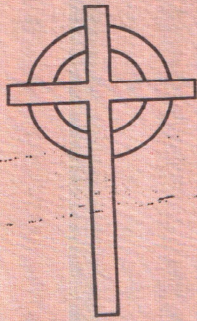
One of the Foremost Men of the South-
west Crosses the Dark River.

Bristol received the sad intelligence Monday of the death of William B. Cobb, of Glade Spring, Va., which occurred in Louisville, Ky., at 3:30 a. m. yesterday. Mr. Cobb was afflicted with lung trouble and had gone to Louisville to be operated upon. The first operation was very successful, and he rallied and did well for a short time, when it became necessary for a second, which was done about ten days ago, after which he grew gradually worse until the end came.

Mr. Cobb was born at Glade Spring thirty years ago, and his parents dying and leaving him an orphan he was adopted and raised by Mrs. Wm. Byars. He grew to manhood, and became a useful and influential citizen, and acquired considerable valuable property, among this a very fine farm, upon which he lived near Glade Spring. Two years ago last June he was happily wedded to Miss Augusta Hundley, of Marion, Va. His wife and one child survive him.

Mr. Cobb was one of the most popular and highly esteemed men in Southwest Virginia, and figured prominently in state conventions and politics. He was a public spirited gentleman, and one of large acquaintance and wide spread influence. He was a member of the Methodist church, a man of honor and integrity, of unblemished character, a true man, one of Nature's noblemen.

Mr. J. C. Byars will go to Glade Spring this morning to arrange for the funeral, which will take place tomorrow. He will be buried by Bristol Lodge No. 232 B. P. Order Elks, of which he was an honored member. The remains are expected to pass through Bristol on No. 6 today.
